Celebrating a Successful OTEC Campaign with Your Help!

Oregon Trail Electric Co-op (OTEC) ballots arrived earlier this week, and we hope you voted for Randy Joseph, the Oregon Rural Action member and renewable energy advocate whose campaign we are supporting. Dozens of members have spent months collecting petition signatures for and telling their friends about Randy's campaign. **Now we need your help!** Please consider taking one or more of the following steps described in the box to the right to support small-scale renewable energy generation in northeast Oregon.

Oregon Rural Action continues to gain influence and publicity for its increasingly effective and lasting work in building thriving local economies and communities. With your help, we can elect Randy Joseph to the OTEC board. Let us know how you'd like to support this campaign today!

We have much to celebrate through our energy campaign in recent months. Two members were instrumental in initiating the Union County Commissioners' establishment of the Union County Renewable Energy

Committee in December 2005. Six members have since have been appointed to this public committee out of its seven available seats; and board member Chuck Koch has been appointed chair of this committee. The committee is charged with making recommendations to the county commissioners on the economic development potential of small- and community-scale renewable energy generation projects, and meets monthly.

Since January, the Blue Mountain Chapter and Baker County Grassroots Alliance have collaborated in collecting a total of 1,241 signatures for three petitions to place candidates and members Randy Joseph and Norm Cimon and one bylaw amendment on the OTEC ballot. Thirty members were involved in this process, during which dozens of green power flyers and Oregon Rural Action brochures were also distributed. Only Randy was able to secure a place on the ballot through this effort, as the cooperative's complicated bylaws deemed only 60% of collected signatures to be valid. To support Randy's campaign, members have made generous contributions that have enabled us to share Randy's green power message in newspaper and radio ads in Union, Baker, and Grant counties. Staff and members organized a candidate forum in Baker and Union counties, each drawing 30 attendees and a local newspaper reporter. At least six letters to the editor have been printed in 2 newspapers, and another 3-5 are expected to be printed in 4 newspapers in the next week.

Thank you for your ongoing support of our work. Let's celebrate the success of our latest efforts to support the development of renewable energy in northeast Oregon!


Help Elect Randy Joseph!

LOCAL FOOD AND FARM DIRECTORY

Food enthusiasts from Baker County Grassroots Alliance and the Blue Mountain Chapter are gathering information to create a Northeast Oregon Food and Farm Directory, which would cover farm and ranch products in Baker, Union, and Wallowa counties. Team members from BCGA and the Blue Mountain Chapter are gathering names to include in the directory. There will be a fee of \$15 to be listed, which includes a one-year membership with Oregon Rural Action; the fee is waived for current members. The areas covered in the Local Food Directory will include: contact information, the farm and ranch products sold and their times of availability, where to buy the products, and their farming practices. The directory will be available at local distribution points and through the ORA office.
